OUR DESIGN ETHOS

- Behavioral Health Design Guide by Behavioral Health Facility Consulting








LIGATURE-RESISTANT BATHROOM DOOR (OMH-NY APPROVED)

- Bathroom door with no known ligature points
- Provides patient privacy and dignity without compromising on safety
- Our pivot design releases at a weight of less than 11lbs in any direction the OMH New York safe limit. With options for varying load release weights (<20lbs & <11lbs), you can select the perfect fit to match your specific risk assessment needs.
- Over 6,000 bathroom doors installed globally without incident
- Ultra-lightweight nibs minimize the risk of weaponization
- Magnets secured away inside framemounted pivots and inaccessible for tampering or ingestion
- Alternate pivot design to suit specific patient groups can be incorporated, utilizing a higher load release force of 20lbs



FEATURES



- 1. Magnetic load release eliminates known ligature risks
- 2. Top and bottom magnets are selflocating and offer superior hold, minimizing unwanted detachments and removing the need to bend down if the leaves do need reattached
- **3.** Leaves are fire retardant and water-resistant
- **4.** Individual leaves are narrow and flexible, making ineffective weapons or shields
- 5. Can be fitted to existing door frames in under 30 minutes, minimizing disruption
- 6. Leaves available in a choice of colors and images, allowing patients to personalize bedrooms
- 7. Standard sizes to ensure short lead times
- 8 Leaves overlap for privacy

LIMITATIONS OF EXISTING OPTIONS

Our robust research process - including first-hand experience in the live ward environment - saw us gather feedback from architects, clinicians and estates teams, exposing the limitations of existing solutions.

- Any two hard surfaces meeting creates a ligature point
- Load release is the only safe option

CUT-DOWN DOOR



- Multiple ligature risks on door frame, hinge and gap
- Can be used as both a weapon and hiding place

DOOR-TOP ALARM



- Low-level anchor points pose risk of bed sheet ligature with alligator roll
- Limits observation when bathroom in use

NO DOOR/CURTAIN

SIDE-HUNG MAGNETIC DOOR

- Lack of dignity and privacy
- Curtain blocks observation and requires regular replacement
- Doesn't emulate home environment




- Side-hung magnets slip too easily day to day and allow anchoring of high forces at certain angles
- Strong magnets in fabric can be removed and swallowed. causing fatal internal injury.


DEVELOPING THE LOAD-RELEASE DESIGN

Years of research and experience taught us that to be truly ligature resistant we needed to move away from solid, fixed doors all together. Thus we needed a load-release concept.

When exploring options together with the New York Office of Mental Health they determined that 11lbs is the upper limit for a safe release force. We also offer a < 20lbs load release weight, to suit your risk assessment needs in your behavioral health space

Testing simple load release doors showed that fitting a single foam leaf directly to the frame magnetically lets you create anchor points in a number of creative ways, well in excess of 11lbs, which the OMH New York deem unacceptable.






We perfected the in-house pivot design to eliminate anchor points on both the hardware AND the lightweight leaves, so even the most creative methods don't result in forces greater than 11Lbs being sustained.

This makes the doors practical in day-to-day use and also allows them to pass the rigorous OMH New York safety testing, which is why it's the only bathroom door they now approve.







OUR LIFESAVING SOLUTION

As well as setting new standards for safety and design, our ligature-resistant bathroom door restores dignity and independence. It's cost effective too, saving up to \$4,000 compared to full doors with door-top alarms.

ENABLES PARTIAL OBSERVATION; PROVIDES DIGNITY

Like cubicle doors in a leisure center, the door acts as a partial visual screen to preserve patient dignity whilst also allowing head and feet observations to give clinicians peace of mind.




SELF-LOCATING MAGNETS: EASY REATTACHMENT

The improved leaves stay firmly in place during day-to-day use and now include selflocating magnets, removing the need to bend down to reattach the leaves if an incident occurs. Magnets are securely housed in the robust frame-mounted pivots.

Our bathroom door for behavioral health is listed and featured in all three standardsetting behavioral health design guides due to the <11lbs load release.




DESIGN COLLABORATION WITH HOSPITAL ROOMS
